This Addendum is issued by the Architect to all bidders of record prior to receipt of proposals. Bidders shall acknowledge receipt of this addendum by so indicating on the Proposal Form. Failure to do so may subject Bidder to disqualification. All information and instructions given herein shall become a part of the Contract Documents.

RFI:

- 1. I'm reviewing the Roller Shade plan details for the shades and find a discrepancy between the verbiage in the specification and the plan details. The spec states a metal fascia for the south facade. Lutron's fascia is 4": I found the plan detail for the south facade to actually be on pg. A5.2 detail 6. This shows a 5" pocket with a reverse roll shade. Can you clarify which design I am to follow? I've attached the CAD for a 4" fascia that follows the spec. If it is desired to run the shades on the south (shown as a reverse roll), an exposed pocket as shown in detail 6 will have to be used. Lutron does not allow reverse roll with their contract fascia system. If the attached standard roll fascia system is sufficient, this will cost less.
 - a. Provide Contract Roller Motorized Shade with Metal Fascia and Top Back Cover/Back Fascia. See attached cut sheet.
- 2. Can you please provide the following: Model of Siemens Switchboard MDSIA & Model number or other identifier for Siemens Tiastar Motor Control Center MCC1
 - a. Model of Switchboard 'MDS1A' is included in Addendum #1. More specific model for Siemens Tiastar Motor Control Center 'MCC1' was not observed.
- 3. Our supplier came back with a few questions in regards to the translucent skylight systems, could you assist with this?:
 - **a.** I do not see any dimensions or pitch noted on the plans. Can you please provide the curb dimension and the pitch? Our standards are 4/12, 6/12, and 7/12.
 - *i.* 4/12 is an acceptable pitch on the skylight system. Curb height to be a min. of 8"
 - b. Do we need to provide translucent endwalls for the skylights? The detail 4/A5.3 shows the endwall as part of the skylight system, however it is not detailed as if it is translucent. I cannot tell if that is to be translucent or built up with other building construction. Can you please provide direction on this?
 - i. Endwall to be translucent and part of skylight system

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- **c.** The design criteria shows the drift loading as "as shown on plans". Is there a drift load plan available? The loads listed in the specs appear to be different than what is listed on the design criteria, specifically the wind loading looks elevated. Which are we to follow?
- *i.* There is drift loading on the lower existing roof but not on the upper roof.
- 4. Regarding Section 265200, 3.1.E.5, may 0-10v dimming conductors be run in the same conduit as the switch leg serving the fixture to be dimmed?
 - a. Route control wiring in separate conduit as the specifications describe.
- 5. I see there is a contradiction with the Skylight finish. The spec states a painted finish and the plans show anodize, please advise which is correct?
 - a. Skylight finish to be clear anodized
- 6. If wall section 2/A5.1 and details 6 & 7/A5.3 are accurate, I'm pretty sure there'll be a fair amount of ponding at a couple of locations. See attached. In general, ponding water and EPDM are not a good combination.
 - a. Provide crickets at potential ponding locations for proper water drainage. See revised roof plan attached.
- 7. Set # 3/ Opening # 147 indicates access control with card reader/ power supply. There is no electrified hardware for that set. Standard lock, flush bolts. Does the set need to be access control and require electrified lockset/ power transfer?
 - a. Yes, please provide electrified locksets at door #147
- 8. Set #4/ opening #141 indicates 45 minute rated opening. Closers are not listed in the set for self-closing requirement for fire rating. Do closers need to be added for the set or is fire rating not required?
 - a. Yes, add closers to maintain 45 min. Rating
- 9. In conversation with the Best factory rep (Bill Stock), he had indicated the school was intending to incorporate a Keystone web key management software system for the Westside schools. It was planned to be added by addenda on either the Middle school or ABC project. I don't see any mention in either addenda. Is the Keystone web key management software need to be included in the Middle school bid?
 - a. This will not be added to this project
- 10. I have some questions about the Westside Middle School bid. T-1 and T-2 are supposed to be 12"x24", but the elevation (5 Interior North) looks like 12"x12"s. Also, there is a 6" tile base. Are we cutting the 12"x24" tile to make the base?
 - a. Interior Finish schedule on A9.1 calls out a random mix of T-1 (12x24) and T-2 (12x12). In the elevation, the tile is shown more as a hatch. It does not represent the blend of the 12x24 and 12x12 tile in the 70/30 mix. If they need us to create a drafting view to explain the installation when we get to shop drawing, we can do that. We are not using base. The 6" band at the bottom is just a ripped 12x24 tile. Since the wainscot is 42", we needed to put 6" somewhere and chose to have it at the base, around the entire room. There will be a coved Schulter between the wall and floor tile, so a coved base is not necessary. Ergon can custom cut the 6" tile. We should have the sub reach out to Michael Montorsi for pricing.
- 11. On sheet C1.6 there is a stacked retaining wall called out at the chiller pad but structural has this wall as CIP. Please confirm this wall shall be CIP and that there are no stacked/segmental walls needed on the project.

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a. Retaining wall to be CIP, no stacked/segmental walls on this project

- 12. Note 17 on sheet C1.4 states to remove and relocate irrigation lines. We are not seeing any other reference to these lines on the drawings. What should we include for this work?
 - a. Typically this is coordinated with the owner or the current irrigation contractor during construction. The school's maintenance staff will sometimes know where the irrigation lines run. Usually the school will contract with an outside company to update/manage the system if there are any tweaks.
- 13. Can we get confirmation that the metal panels at the mechanical enclosure are to be directly installed to the structural steel system as shown on 18/S5.1. No hat channel, infill framing or substrate will be required?
 - a. Yes, perforated metal panels to be attached directly to structural steel.
- 14. The demolition plans for the roof do not provide any detail with respect to existing mechanical units, skylights, ballast, etc. The plan note simply says "remove existing roofing membrane, coverboard and insulation in its entirety down to existing deck". If demo is required, do you have any information on what is actually present in terms of insulation depth and attachment method, and is there ballast to be removed as well?
 - a. Yes, there is ballast on the roof that will be part of the demo scope. No core drills were done during design, but it's assumed that there is a min. of 5" of rigid insulation adhered to the existing coverboard & membrane.
- 15. Existing GE Spectra Series Switchboard "MDS2" is not shown on the print. Is it located in Mechanical Room E131? I need to confirm feeder routing for RTU-C.
 - a. This is shown on the First Floor Key Plan Electrical: 3/E0.0.
- 16. Can you please confirm if there is to be any flooring finish and/or wall base in the lower-level rooms Storage 147 & Mechanical Room 141 for the Westside Middle School project?
 - a. No floor finish or wall base in either room







Scope of Work

Grading

Scope of Work

The Subcontractor shall execute the following portion of the Work described in the Subcontract Agreement Documents, including all labor, materials, equipment, services, on site supervision, and other items required to complete such portion of the work:

Grading – Including, but not limited to, Specification Sections:

- Division 00 Procurement Requirements (As Applies)
- Division 01 General Requirements (As Applies)
- Division 02 Existing Conditions (As Applies)

- 1. Review and acknowledgment of 100% Contract Documents dated March 22, 2024 and all Addenda issued by BVH Architects.
- Subcontractor shall provide background checks for all employees on Project site. The determination
 to place an employee or second-tier subcontractor on site will be the sole responsibility of the
 Subcontractor after receiving the results of a background check through the Department of Justice
 or by using One Source background check software.
- 3. Comply with WCS's drug-free Policies and Regulations. The use of any and all tobacco products is prohibited while on WCS property.
- 4. Subcontractor to provide detailed daily reports to Contractor's Superintendent weekly. Reports are to include, but not limited to, location and description of work, equipment, and crew size.
- 5. Coordination required includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - a. Installation of all work.
 - b. Progress schedules, including submittals and deliveries.
 - c. Coordination meetings between subcontractors.
 - d. Progress meetings.
 - e. Coordination drawings as required by the Contract Documents.
 - f. Coordination meetings and collaboration with Owner subcontractors.
- 6. Subcontractor shall coordinate with all overhead trades as required by the Contractor to achieve an acceptable installation.
- 7. Subcontractor shall provide all required submittals within (2) weeks of notice of award.
- 8. Subcontractor is responsible for coordinating and scheduling all inspections and tests required by code with the authority having jurisdiction and the Contractor in accordance with the most recent project schedule.
- 9. Site phasing and sequencing as determined by Contractor.
- 10. Subcontractor to provide a schedule for procurement of long-lead-time items which will constitute part of the work as required to meet the project schedule. Subcontractor shall expedite all delivery of long-lead-time items.
- 11. Complete work according to schedule milestones and durations as to not delay the start or completion of other work.
- 12. Provide sufficient labor and supervision, including incidental overtime, as necessary for the performance of the Work in accordance with the Contractor's Project Schedule.

- 13. All specialty power and temporary meter/water supply as required for the Scope of Work for the full duration of the project unless noted otherwise.
- 14. Coordinate with Contractor's and Owner's testing and inspection agencies for all testing required by "Tests and Inspections" in the Contract Documents. All re-inspection fees and penalties associated with non-complying Work shall be the Subcontractor's responsibility.
- 15. Provide off-site warehousing of permanent materials as needed.
- 16. As-built drawings shall be available for Hausmann Construction Inc. review at all times.
- 17. Contractor's Project Manager must approve all field work ticket and Proposed Change Order (PCO) work before the work is started.
- 18. In accordance with Contract Documents, the Subcontractor shall furnish everything necessary to perform all supply and installation work for all **Grading** work including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. Complete all above referenced and herein Scope of Work.
 - b. Provide surveying and layout as needed to perform this Scope of Work.
 - c. Provide all necessary equipment and means to remove debris from property.
 - d. Ensure Work does not interrupt services to existing facilities remaining in use by the public and/or Owner except as planned by Contractor.
 - e. All site grading, cutting, fill, backfill, compaction, spoils removal, hauling, and paving backfill. Final grade to be within plus or minus one tenth of one foot of designed elevation.
 - f. Include all site removals.
 - g. Incidental Work as required to complete herein Scope of Work.
 - h. All hoisting, handling, sorting, loading, and laydown.
 - i. Shall furnish, maintain, and remove all required temporary work.
 - j. Install and removal of all erosion control (maintenance will be by GC).
 - k. All barricades and traffic control.
 - 1. Subcontractor shall provide all daily cleanup of work areas with attention to debris, which may have been moved into adjacent public pedestrian/traffic areas.

General Provision:

- 1. The Subcontractor shall provide all permits, plan checks, licenses, inspections and associated fees (if necessary) to complete this Scope of Work.
- 2. The Subcontractor, if applicable, shall cooperate fully with all building inspection officials with the review and inspection of this Scope of Work. The Subcontractor shall promptly remedy all rejected or disapproved work by building inspection officials.
- 3. The Subcontractor, if applicable, shall cooperate fully with all testing laboratory and inspection personnel with the review and inspection of this Scope of Work. The Subcontractor shall promptly address remedies required for non-conforming work. The Subcontractor shall be responsible for the cost of re-work and re-inspection fees as a result of testing or inspection failure.
- 4. The Subcontractor shall be responsible for all traffic control including flag men and barricades as required for the execution of this Scope of Work. The Subcontractor shall coordinate with the Contractor all street closings and rerouting of traffic and pedestrians required by the work, including necessary street use, lane closures, sidewalk closures and/or right of way permits.
- 5. The Subcontractor shall provide for Owner attic stock as required by the Contract Documents. All materials will be inventoried, boxed or packaged with clear identification of all components. All items will be turned over in a location provided by the Owner and/or Contractor.
- 6. The Subcontractor shall provide dust and exhaust control as required for this Scope of Work.
- 7. The Subcontractor shall follow the punch list program protocol per Contractor's direction.
- 8. The Subcontractor shall provide daily cleanup and removal of all trash and debris generated by this Scope of Work. The Subcontractor shall participate in mandatory composite jobsite cleanup as required by Contractor. Dumpsters shall be provided by the Contractor. The Subcontractor to haul trash generated by this Scope of Work to correct dumpsters per the Contractor's direction.

- 9. The Subcontractor shall keep all streets and roadways clean and free of mud, dirt and debris throughout the duration of this project as it relates to this Scope of Work.
